

Undoubtedly the Book bears that character, for it is a collection of tracts, the work of above thirty authors, who utter what they have to say, not contemporaneously, but in succession, and along a vast line of time, --about sixteen hundred years; yet, as De Quincey puts it, all the writers combine to one end, and lock, like parts of a great machine, into one system. This organic unity is very remarkable. Whether Moses, or Paul, or John speaks, the impression left is, that behind each is one and the same guiding intelligence. If the Book is not more than literature it is a delusion and a snare, since it professes to bear a much higher character. Whoever wrote or edited the Pentateuch, for example, certainly regarded his work as something different from an ordinary literary production. He believed that he was recording things, a knowledge of which could only have been obtained by direct communication with the Eternal. The Jewish nation has always accepted these documents, in whatever way they were produced, as being what they profess to be, plain and reliable accounts of the dealings of God with their fathers. I may, if I will, insist that a great part of this early history of mankind is legendary; but I scarcely see how I can justify the assertion. I have, indeed, had no experience of a miracle, but I know no reason why I should therefore...
